Fire Permit Changes Effective 4/18/2012 for Town of Madison

Due to high level of fire danger throughout the State of New Hampshire it has become necessary to suspend all fire permits, including seasonal issued fire permits until substantial rain has improved conditions.

ALL PERMITS IN THE TOWN OF MADISON ARE SUSPENDED UNTIL THE FIRE DANGER CLASSIFICATION IS AT A CLASS 3 OR LOWER DAY.

This will begin the new rules to be observed by any holder of any fire permit issued by the Town of Madison.

Absolutely no burning of any permit category unless a class 3 or lower fire danger day. This is in effect all year long no exceptions.

All permit holders should have adequate capability to extinguish any fire if it gets out of control.

NO burning allowed outside of the designated protective fire rings for Category 1 or 2 permits.

No burning of any material or limitations as indicated on the rear of your issued fire permit.

All fires are to be completely extinguished, cool to touch if unattended.

Any variation from rules posted on permits, or from this notification will be considered a violation and a written violation notice, the revocation of permit, and any cost of extinguishing fire will be issued to the permit holder of record. Rental property owners are responsible to post rules and regulations if granting seasonal permit usage to tenants. You must provide the Town of Madison written permission allowing your tenants to either obtain their own dated permits or use your issued seasonal permit.
