How it works:

Madison Library's Summer Reading Programs are planned to encourage reading for fun. We offer programs for all ages, from 3 to 103, because reading is an activity that can be enjoyed for a lifetime!

For kids 3 to 5:

(Parents of 5-year-olds, choose the best program for your child, this one or the following.)

- Pick up an early literacy activity sheet.
- Bring the sheet in the library each time you complete an activity for a sticker. You don't have to do the activities in order.

For kids 5 to 12:

(12 year olds, choose the program that fits you best, this one or the teen program)

- Pick up a reading log to keep a list of the books you read over the summer. Please also record how many minutes you spend reading on the provided sheet.
- Bring your reading log each time you visit the library for a sticker. Log the minutes you spend reading on your tally sheet.

To be eligible for prizes, which will be awarded at our wrap-up party on August 13, you need to bring your activity sheet or reading log to the library by <u>Friday</u>, <u>August 8</u>.

For teens age 12 - 17 AND for adults 18+

- Read any book.
- For each book, submit a brief book review.
 Reviews can be submitted online (find the link on the library's website), or by writing your name and a short review on a review slip available at the library.
- On July 16 and again on July 30, one teen reader's and one adult reader's review will be randomly drawn for a prize. If you win the first drawing, you won't be eligible to win the second, but all of your reading will count towards the grand prize for the teen or adult who reads the most books.

To be eligible for prizes, which will be awarded at our wrap-up party on August 13, you need to bring your **reviews** to the library, or submit them online, by **Friday**, **August 8**.
